Framed by the themes of opportunity, liberty, compassion, and responsibility, the complex reveals the life and career of our nation's 43rd president and 46th governor of Texas, while also advocating a better insight of the American presidency, American history, and important issues of public policy.



The **Nasher Sculpture Center**, in the Cultural Arts District in downtown Dallas, is a serene urban retreat for the enjoyment of modern art.



It is one of few institutions in the world devoted to the exhibition, study, and preservation of modern and contemporary sculpture.



The **Perot Museum of Nature and Science** is said to be a "world of wonder" by *The Dallas Morning News*. Get ready to enhance your brain through hands-on learning experiences. The museum exposes visitors to a world of ideas and concepts in science, technology, and math; it inspires curiosity and boasts itself as a living science lesson. Ponder the vast mysteries of science. The Museum reminds us that the universe is grander than ourselves, older than we can fathom, and that the world actually revolves around the sun, and not us.



The world-famous **Tyler Rose Garden Center** preserves and displays the story of Tyler's rose growing trade. Pageantry of the Texas Rose Festival is shown by means of collector's items, interactive exhibits, and elaborate costumes and accessories from past festivals.



The **East Texas Oil Museum**, located on the campus of Kilgore College, houses the authentic re-creation of oil discovery and production in the early 1930s. Here, you see Boomtown, USA – a full scale town full of stores, people, animals, and technology illustrating the lively activity of a town booming in the oil industry.

Wanderers will stop at the **Vintage Grill & Car Museum** in Weatherford to experience farm-to-table southern style cuisine, plus an eclectic collection of vintage automobiles.
